CHAIRPERSON'S MESSAGE



*“ Purpose with Passion to
drive Progress ”*

Dear Members,

It gives me great pleasure in presenting to you this Annual Report and Audited Accounts of The Chartered Institute of Logistics & Transport (CILT) for the period ending 31st March 2020. Being our Centenary year, 2019 was an important one for the CILT family. As we approached the 36th year of CILT, we continued to strengthen the activities derived from the strategic plan under the three strategic pillars through focused initiatives executed with rigour, where results had been greatly encouraging.

Driving Membership Growth

Our members are our greatest asset. During the past year, we provided them with value added services, while new members were reached via Road Shows, which was our proven formula for success. Twenty (20) Road Shows were conducted during this period in all sectors with clear communication on member benefits, expanding membership evaluation panel and evaluation lead times were improved. As a result, overall membership grew by 79% (excluding student members). Six Fellow members, the highest inducted during a year and a significant

increase in CMILT and MILT members were noted. New members grew by 98% while upgrades increased by 43%. Member achievements were recognized and their articles featured in the Link magazine. CILT Sri Lanka was also appointed to evaluate CILT international membership applications for Indian Ocean Islands (IOI). CILT expanded its reach to Central and Southern provinces and plans have been put in place to increase the footprint to other Provinces as well. Membership also grew across sectors due to the focused efforts of the four sectional committees.

Corporate Partners

I am thankful to our Corporate Partners (CP) who continued to support CILT. Four new partners joined hands with us during the year. In spite of the Covid-19 impact our CP member contribution is greatly appreciated. Shortly, CILT will be launching the International Business Forum (IBF) and CILT Sri Lanka has been chosen to conduct the pilot with CILT Australia prior to rolling out this initiative globally. The IBF will immensely benefit our CPs.

CHAIRPERSON'S MESSAGE

Membership Services

Past one year witnessed a hive of activities with a packed event calendar, which reached both our members and non-members alike. In view of CILT's Centenary year celebration, the flagship International Conference and the Centenary dinner celebration was held on the same day on a grand scale. The CILT International President Dato Radzak Malek, FCILT graced the occasion as the Guest of Honour. To symbolically commemorate the Centenary year, a bell ringing was done to open trading at the Colombo Stock Exchange. The three memorial lectures and two Logistics Leaders Evenings were well attended. We collaborated with Centre for Employment, Entrepreneurship and Innovation Development (CEEID), Post Graduate Institute of Management Alumni (PIMA), European Chamber of Commerce (ECC) and Company of Master Mariners (CMM) to conduct joint events. CILT conducted Field visits to Port City, Ceylon Cold Stores, Multi Modal Transport Centre (MMTC), Mattala International Airport, FPSO at Hambantota International Port Group (HIPG), Rathmalana Airport and Air traffic control tower and Air Force Museum. Regency Tea factory and HIPG and Port of Colombo visit by WiLAT and YPF respectively were value adding to our members. One of the notable achievements during the term was the launch of C-Confluence in partnership with Chartered Institute of Management Accountants (CIMA), Chartered Institute of Marketing (CIM) and Chartered Institute of Personnel Management (CIPM), which was well received by the industry.

Education and Accreditation

It was encouraging to note the interest from public universities and private degree awarding institutes to get the CILT accreditation for their degree programs. Education sub committee actively pursued these requests with rigour by assessing the Key Knowledge Areas to ensure compliance to CILT accreditation requirements. University of Moratuwa Transport and Logistics Management BSc degree and Kothalawala Defense University both BSc and MBA degree programs in logistics were awarded with the accreditation certificates. Ocean University degree program was audited in January 2020 and will be awarded with the CILT accreditation. For the first time, a CILT student member was awarded the AMFUF Peace Travel Scholarship to visit South Korea on an international student exchange program and she made CILT and Sri Lanka proud by receiving the most valuable person award. More universities joined the CILT university network and currently there are Fourteen (14) in our fold. This augurs well to develop a continuous pipeline of young student members to CILT and also for students to get more opportunities through our network.

External Engagements

CILT is now part of the industry related policy development work and was consulted regularly by the government authorities and invited to attend various forums to provide our views and advice to policy makers. CILT was proactive in policy advocacy and made representations and contributed to aviation, maritime, port and transport sector policy developments. External engagements are important as CILT's presence enhances our professional image and the reach.

CHAIRPERSON'S MESSAGE

Publicity and Branding

Top of mind awareness and reach has increased considerably due to numerous initiatives undertaken by sub committees and the publicity given. A special print edition of the Link magazine was published in November 2019 to commemorate the Centenary year. Revamping the layout design and improvement to the content gave a new look to the Link magazine. The positive feedback received from the membership for the magazine is encouraging. I am thankful to the young Editorial team for their enthusiasm to improve the magazine to provide a more professional outlook.

Strengthening the Secretariat

The Secretariat staff was trained to improve their effectiveness with an external resource. Clear role clarity through job descriptions, investment in a new membership database, RFID enabled membership card, introduction of a Point of Sales (POS) system for payments, and document archiving system further strengthened the CILT Secretariat activities. We were in the last stage of realizing our long awaited goal to reincorporate CILT and the gazette was at the cabinet approval stage when the parliament was dissolved in February 2020. We are hopeful that we can commence from the final stage once the new parliament resumes. CILT By-Laws were ratified at the 2019 AGM and its now in use.

Resilient Response

In response to Covid-19, CILT locally and globally engaged in activities to meet the threat, supporting the local response. As a result of the enforced curfew, CILT AGM and our usual engagements could not be done as planned.

As a leading professional body, CILT adjusted to the new normal by engaging in activities, which the situation demanded. A donation was made to NHSL and Army with medical items; an ideathon and webinars were conducted. Ideathon responded to the needs of the time, was well executed by the young team and demonstrated the capabilities of CILT to rise up to the occasion. CILT would develop an incubating platform shortly to support the operationalization of these ideas.

Appreciation

I am grateful to CILT Council, WiLAT Executive Committee, YPF Core Committee, Membership, our Corporate Partners and the Secretariat Staff for their unstinted support and commitment to make the past two years of my term productive. As I hand over the baton to my successor, I wish the incoming Council well in taking CILT to greater heights and wish CILT Sri Lanka every success for the future.

The Chartered Institute of Transport (CIT) Sri Lanka was established on 3rd September 1984 and the founding Chairman was Eng. L.S De Silva, FCILT. CIT was incorporated by the parliamentary act no. 08 of 2000. In 2001, following the merger of the two leading professional bodies, CIT Sri Lanka became the Chartered Institute of Logistics and Transport (CILT) Sri Lanka. In 2012, the Council of Trustees of CILT upgraded the status of CILT Sri Lanka from a Branch to a Territory. In doing so, the Council of Trustees recognized the high standards in performance, governance and membership development evidenced by CILT Sri Lanka over the past several years. This upgrading of status took place at the CILT International Convention and Annual General Meeting held in Birmingham from 11th - 14th June 2012. Her Royal Highness Princess Anne, the Princess Royal, who is the Patron of the Institute,

presented then Chairman, CILT Sri Lanka, the notice of upgrade to Mr. Romesh David CMILT. A Council consisting of professionals representing all segments of the Transport and Logistics industry governs CILT Sri Lanka.

CILT Sri Lanka consists of two forums Women in Logistics and Transport (WiLAT) Sri Lanka and Young Professionals' Forum (YPF) Sri Lanka, which are dedicated for the development and empowerment of women and youth of the logistics and transport industry.

Corporate Partnership Program (CPP)

Corporate partnership program is one of the key priority focus areas for CILT globally with a view to uplift the image of CILT and to promote the profession among the Corporates. CILT Sri Lanka launched its CPP in October 2011. Over the past few years CILT

has seen a steady increase in the number of Corporate Partners. CILT's global strategic thrust is to have an inclusive approach to include all stakeholders engaged in logistics, transport, associated services which could be broadly categorized under the following categories:

- Operators - Directly involved in providing logistics and transport services
- Suppliers - Companies providing products and services to logistics companies
- Manufacturers - Users of logistics services
- Retailers/Sellers - Those who require logistics services
- Education - Academic institutions providing logistics related programs
- Military
- Government

In order to adopt a more inclusive approach CILT Sri Lanka revamped its CPP in January 2018. Under the revamped CPP, Corporates can choose between four corporate partner packages namely, Platinum, Gold, Silver or Bronze to partner with CILT Sri Lanka. In the new CP scheme, CPs who have been with CILT CP program from the inception in 2011 were recognized as Patron Partners. Out of the 15 originally inducted as CPs 13 have been continuing with CILT and are categorized as Patron Partners. The CP program is an annually renewable contract and the term is from 31st December 2019 to 1st January 2020. As at 1st January 2020 CILT had 27 CPs enrolled

under the revamped CPP. In view of Covid-19 impact five (05) CPs had decided not to renew their commitments for 2020. Three (03) CPs are having discussion with CILT. However four (04) new CPs, Fonterra Brands Pvt Ltd, Ocean University, Emergent Cold and TWS joined this year making the total CP number 22. The Corporate Partnership Program is a unique opportunity for companies to partner with CILT Sri Lanka, for mutual benefit. CILT is hopeful that the CPs who did not renew will rejoin the program next year and reap the benefits.

1. CORPORATE INFORMATION

1.1 Reporting Entity

The Chartered Institute of Logistics and Transport Sri Lanka (“the Institute”) is an Association registered and located at 450, D.R. Wijewardana Mawatha, Colombo 10.

1.2 Principal Activities and nature of Operation

The principal activities of the Institute are to promote and encourage the art and science of logistics and transport. The Association is governed by the Council members in accordance with the rules set out in the rule book of the Association.

2. BASIS OF PREPARATION

2.1 Statement of Compliance

The financial statements of the Institute which comprise of the statement of financial position, statement of income and expenditure and accumulated fund and statement of cash flows together with the accounting policies and notes to the financial statements of the institute as at 31st December 2019 and for the year then ended are prepared in accordance with Sri Lanka Accounting Standard for Small and Medium – sized Entities (“SLFRS for SME’s) adopted by the institute of Chartered Accountants of Sri Lanka (ICASL).

2.2 Responsibility for Financial statements

The committee members are responsible for the preparation and presentation of the Financial Statements.

2.3 Approval of Financial Statements by Directors

The Financial Statements for the year ended 31st December 2019, were authorized for issue by the Board of Directors on 10th March 2020.

The Committee members are responsible for the preparation and presentation of the Financial Statements.

2.4 Basis of Measurement

The Financial Statements have been prepared on the historical cost basis and applied consistently with no adjustments being made for inflationary factors affecting the financial statements.

These Financial Statements have been prepared on the basis that the Institute would continue as a going concern for the foreseeable future.

2.5 Functional and Presentation Currency

The Financial Statements are presented in Sri Lankan Rupee (LKR), which is the Institute’s functional currency.

2. BASIS OF PREPARATION (CONTINUED)

2.6 Use of Estimates and Judgments

The preparation of the financial statements in conformity with SLFRS for SMEs requires management to make judgments, estimates and assumptions that affect the application of accounting policies and the reported amounts of assets, liabilities, income and expenses. Actual results may differ from these estimates. The estimates and underlying assumptions are reviewed on an ongoing basis. Revisions to accounting estimates are recognized in the period in which the estimates are revised if the revision affect only that period or in the period or revision and future periods if the revision affects both current and future periods.

2.7 Materiality and Aggregation

Each material class of similar items is presented separately in the financial statements. Items of a dissimilar nature or function are presented separately unless they are immaterial.

3. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT POLICIES

The accounting policies set out below have been applied consistently to all periods presented in these financial statements unless otherwise indicated.

Certain comparative amounts in the financial statements have been reclassified to conform to the current year's presentation.

(a) Foreign Currency Translation

All transactions in foreign currencies are translated to Sri Lanka Rupees at the foreign exchange rates prevailing at the time of such transactions. Monetary assets and liabilities denominated in foreign currencies at the reporting date are translated into Sri Lanka Rupees at the foreign exchange rates prevailing on that date. The foreign exchange differences arising on translation are recognized in the Statement of income and expenditure and accumulated fund.

(b) Cash and cash equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents comprise cash balances and call deposits with maturities of three months or less from the acquisition date that are subject to an insignificant risk of changes in their fair value and are used by the Institute in the management of its short-term commitments. The statement of Cash Flow is reported based on the indirect method.

(c) Property, plant and equipment

(i) Recognition and measurement

Items of property, plant and equipment are measured at cost less accumulated depreciation and accumulated impairment losses. Cost includes expenditure that is directly attributable to the acquisition of the asset. The cost of self-constructed assets includes the Cost of materials and direct labour, any other costs directly attributable to bringing the assets to a working condition for their intended use and when the group of asset to obligation to remove the asset or restore the site, an estimate of the costs of dismantling and removing the items and restoring the site on which they are located, and capitalized borrowing costs.

(c) Property, plant and equipment (continued)

Purchased software that is integral to the functionality of the related equipment is capitalized as part of that equipment.

When an item of property, plant and equipment have different useful lives, they are accounted for as separate items (major components) of property, plant and equipment.

Any gains and losses on disposal of an item of property, plant and equipment is recognized in profit or loss.

(ii) Subsequent Measurement

Subsequent expenditure is capitalized only when it is probable that the future economic benefits associated with the expenditure will flow to the Institute incurred.

(iii) Depreciation

Items of property, plant and equipment are depreciated on a straight- line basis in profit or loss over the estimated useful lives of each component.

Items of property, plant and equipment are depreciated from the date that they are installed and are ready for use, or in respect of internally constructed assets, from the date that the asset is completed and ready for use.

The estimated useful lives of Property, plant and equipment are as follows:

All assets are depreciated from the month of the asset is available for use up to the month of disposal.

(d) Revenue recognition

Revenue is recognized to the extent that it is probable that the economic benefits will flow to the Institute and the revenue can be reliably measured on an accrual basis. Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable. The following specific criteria are used for the purpose of recognition of revenue.

(i) Membership subscription

Membership subscription is accounted for on time accrual basis.

(i) Interest income

Interest income represents the interest on fixed deposits and is accounted on accrual basis.

(e) Expenses

All expenditure incurred in the operations of the business and in maintaining the capital assets in a state of efficiency have been charged to income in arriving at the Institute's profit/loss for the year.

(f) Funds

i) Unrestricted funds

Unrestricted funds are those that are available for use by the organization at the discretion of the Committee, in furtherance of the general objectives of the organization and which are not designated for any specific purpose.

ii) Restricted funds

Where the grants are received for use in an identified project or activity, such funds are held in a restricted fund account and transferred to the statement of income and expenditure to match with expenses incurred in respect of identified project. Utilized funds are held in their respective fund accounts and included under accumulated fund in the statement of financial position until such time as they are required.

iii) Designated funds

Unrestricted funds designated by the Committee for a specific purpose are identified as designated funds. The activities for which these funds may be used are identified in the financial statements.

(g) Income Tax Expenses

Income tax expense comprises current and deferred tax. Income tax is recognized in the income statement except to the extent that it relates to items recognized directly in equity, in which case it is recognized in equity.

(i) Current tax

Current tax is the expected tax payable on the taxable income for the year, using tax rates enacted at the reporting date, and any adjustment to tax payable in respect of previous years.

(ii) Deferred tax

Deferred tax is provided using the liability method, on for temporary differences between the carrying amounts of assets and liabilities for financial reporting purposes and the tax base of assets and liabilities, which is the amount attributed to those assets and liabilities for tax purposes. The amount of deferred tax provided is based on the expected manner of realization or settlement of the carrying amount of assets and liabilities, using tax rates enacted or substantively enacted as at the reporting date. Deferred tax liabilities are not recognized for the permanent differences.

(h) Events occurring after the reporting date

All material events occurring after reporting date events have been considered and where necessary adjustments to or disclosures in the financial statements have been made.

(i) Capital commitments and contingencies

Contingencies are possible assets or obligations that arise from a past event and would be confirmed only on the occurrence or non-occurrence of uncertain future events, which are beyond the Institute's control.

Commitments and contingent liabilities are disclosed in notes to the financial statements.
