At the Savoy Hotel in London, on 3 November 1919, a group of senior transport professionals met determined to change the world of logistics and transport. This was the birth of the Institute of Transport.

In 2001 we became the Chartered Institute of Logistics and Transport as the two leading professional bodies joined together.

As a family of professionals we come together in our annual International Convention in a different global location each year. There we reflect on our aims and plan our future. The Chartered Institute of Transport (CIT) Sri Lanka was established in 1984 and incorporated by the parliamentary act no. 08 of 2000. In 2001, following the merger of the two leading professional bodies, CIT Sri Lanka became the Chartered Institute of Logistics and Transport (CILT) Sri Lanka. In 2012, the Council of Trustees of CILT upgraded the status of CILT Sri Lanka from a Branch to a Territory. In doing so, the Council of Trustees recognized the high standards in performance, governance and membership development evidenced by CILT Sri Lanka over the past several years. This upgrading of status took place at the CILT International Convention and Annual General Meeting held in Birmingham from 11 - 14 June 2012. The notice of upgrade was presented to Mr. Romesh David, CMILT, then Chairman of CILT Sri Lanka, by Her Royal Highness Princess Anne, the Princess Royal, who is the Patron of the Institute. CILT Sri Lanka is governed by a Council consisting of professionals representing all segments of the Transport and Logistics industry.

CILT Sri Lanka consists of two wings, Women in Logistics and Transport (WiLAT) Sri Lanka and Next Generation Sri Lanka, which are dedicated for the development and empowerment of women and youth of the logistics and transport industry.



## Inauguration Ceremony of the CILT Mentoring Program-



Being an island nation and situated in a strategic location,Sri Lankahas the potential todevelop as a logistics hubwith the proper implementation of strategic plans. The Logistics field has grown up from ancient times when people used animals to transport to the modern world today where ituses artificial intelligence.

Hence it is a major challenge to adapt to the new systems, optimization techniques, infrastructure developments, and professional developments of the human resources. Financial management and project planning and business plans are needed to be laid out considering the future economic growth of the country.

Covid 19 gave a good lesson to the world showing how the entire world can be affected by disasters and how the supply chain can be disturbed in such situations. The Chartered Institute of Logistics and Transport (CILT) Sri Lanka, held its annual P. B. Karandawala Memorial Lecture on February 27, 2023, at the IESL Auditorium from 5.30 p.m. onwards jointly with the Company of Master Mariners (CMM).

The late P. B. Karandawala is well known in pioneering the development of the maritime sector in Sri Lanka. Mr. Karandawala holds the rare distinction of being the Chairman of 3 state transportation entities during the 1970s, which were related to three different modes of transport. They are the Ceylon Shipping Corporation, Air Ceylon, and the Ceylon Transport Board. He is the one who established the National Shipping Line and structured several independent organizations such as the Freight Bureau, the Ceylon Shipping Lines, the Port Services, and the Colombo Dock Yard to support the organization.

The title for the memorial lecture this time was "Emission Reduction Pathways for Marine Transportation". The lecture was delivered by the Keynote Speaker; Mr. Saman A. Kumarasinghe. Undergraduates from different universities and other members of CILT SL participated in this event.

Mr. Saman A. Kumarasinghe is a Chartered Marine Engineer and a fellow member of the Institute of Marine Engineering Science and Technology UK. He is also an associate member of the Royal Institute of Naval Architects UK. Mr. Kymarasinghe has nearly 38 years of industry experience. When having a glimpse at his work history, he worked as a Chief Engineer at Caser and Irvin shipping and later at London ship managers before giving up his career at sea in 2005. He started his first job ashore at a 60 MW power barge situated in the port of Colombo as a Senior mechanical engineer. Then he joined the Indian Register of Shipping in 2006 as an engineer surveyor and in 2007 he joined Germanischer Lloyd China as a new building engineer surveyor and worked in China. Later in 2010, he was transferred to Germanischer Lloyd Singapore and then to the Germanicher Lloyd Colombo in the same year. Since the year 2010, Mr. Kumarasinghe is attached to the DNV Colombo office and is the principal surveyor and the Country manager of the DNV Maritime country office in Sri Lanka. Mr. Kumarasinghe is also the DNV project manager for building of 10 hybrid general dry cargo ships currently being built at Colombo Dockyard PLC for Misje Ecobulk company Norway.

In his speech, Mr. Kumarasinghe elaborated on different sources of maritime pollution and the regions which are mostly prone to marine pollution. Mr. Kumarasinghe also explained the current practices in the industry and the Conventions as well as the International Professional Bodies overlooking this issue. He further explained the alternatives that can be deployed to reduce emissions in maritime transportation and the pros and cons of each.




# Introductory Session of Knowledge Hub by WiLAT Sri Lanka






# The online workshop on Local Import and Export procedures and payment methods

# Discussion on "Data Analytics in Transport and Logistics"

In the Transportation & Logistics sector, data analytics is critical for meeting customer demands in a timely and cost-effective manner. These industries are critical to the economy and the flow of people and products. However, the transportation industry's competitive nature makes data management challenging for data analytics specialists. The constraints of traditional data analysis as well as the importance of data-driven approaches in the transportation and logistics industries were discussed in the session.

#### 1. CORPORATE INFORMATION

#### 1.1 Reporting Entity

The Chartered Institute of Logistics and Transport Sri Lanka ("the Institute") is an Association registered and located at 464, T.B Jayah Mawatha, 1st Floor, Colombo 10, Sri Lanka.

#### 1.2 Principal Activities and Nature of Operation

The principal activities of the Institute are to promote and encourage the art and science of logistics and transport. The Association is governed by the Council members in accordance with the rules set out in the rule book of the Association.

#### 2. BASIS OF PREPARATION

#### 2.1 Statement of Compliance

The financial statements of the Institute which comprise of the statement of financial position, statement of income and expenditure and accumulated fund and statement of cash flows together with the accounting policies and notes to the financial statements of the institute as at 31<sup>st</sup> December 2022 and for the year then ended are prepared in accordance with Sri Lanka Accounting Standard for Small and Medium – sized Entities ("SLFRS for SME's) adopted by the institute of Chartered Accountants of Sri Lanka (ICASL).

#### 2.2 Responsibility for Financial statements

The committee members are responsible for the preparation and presentation of the Financial Statements.

# 2.3 Approval of Financial Statements by Committee of members

The Financial Statements for the year ended 31st December 2022, were authorized for issue by the Committee of members on 21th March 2023.

#### 2.4 Basis of Measurement

The Financial Statements have been prepared on the historical cost basis and applied consistently with no adjustments being made for inflationary factors affecting the financial statements.

These Financial Statements have been prepared on the basis that the Institute would continue as a going concern for the foreseeable future.

#### 2.5 Functional and Presentation Currency

The Financial Statements are presented in Sri Lankan Rupee (LKR), which is the Institute's functional currency.

# 2.6 Use of Estimates and Judgments

The preparation of the financial statements in conformity with SLFRS for SMEs requires management to make judgments, estimates and assumptions that affect the application of accounting policies and the reported amounts of assets, liabilities, income and expenses. Actual results may differ from these estimates. The estimates and underlying assumptions are reviewed on an ongoing basis. Revisions to accounting estimates are recognized in the period in which the estimates are revised if the revision affect only that period or in the period or revision and future periods if the revision affects both current and future periods.



#### 2. BASIS OF PREPARATION (CONTINUED)

# 2.7 Materiality and Aggregation

Each material class of similar items is presented separately in the financial statements. Items of a dissimilar nature or function are presented separately unless they are immaterial.

#### 3. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT POLICIES

The accounting policies set out below have been applied consistently to all periods presented in these financial statements unless otherwise indicated.

Certain comparative amounts in the financial statements have been reclassified to conform to the current year's presentation.

#### (a) Foreign Currency Translation

All transactions in foreign currencies are translated to Sri Lanka Rupees at the foreign exchange rates prevailing at the time of such transactions. Monetary assets and liabilities denominated in foreign currencies at the reporting date are translated into Sri Lanka Rupees at the foreign exchange rates prevailing on that date. The foreign exchange differences arising on translation are recognized in the Statement of income and expenditure and accumulated fund.

# (b) Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents comprise cash balances and call deposits with maturities of three months or less from the acquisition date that are subject to an insignificant risk of changes in their fair value and are used by the Institute in the management of its short-term commitments. The statement of Cash Flow is reported based on the indirect method.

#### (c) Property, Plant and Equipment

# (i) Recognition and Measurement

Items of property, plant and equipment are measured at cost less accumulated depreciation and accumulated impairment losses. Cost includes expenditure that is directly attributable to the acquisition of the asset. The cost of self-constructed assets includes the Cost of materials and direct labour, any other costs directly attributable to bringing the assets to a working condition for their intended use and when the group of asset to obligation to remove the asset or restore the site, an estimate of the costs of dismantling and removing the items and restoring the site on which they are located, and capitalized borrowing costs. Purchased software that is integral to the functionality of the related equipment is capitalized as part of that equipment.

When an item of property, plant and equipment have different useful lives, they are accounted for as separate items (major components) of property, plant and equipment. Any gains and losses on disposal of an item of property, plant and equipment is recognized in profit or loss.

### (ii) Subsequent Measurement

Subsequent expenditure is capitalized only when it is probable that the future economic benefits associated with the expenditure will flow to the Institute incurred.



#### 3. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT POLICIES (CONTINUED)

# (c) Property, Plant and Equipment (Continued)

#### (iii) Depreciation

Items of property, plant and equipment are depreciated on a straight- line basis in profit or loss over the estimated useful lives of each component. Items of property, plant and equipment are depreciated from the date that they are installed and are ready for use, or in respect of internally constructed assets, from the date that the asset is completed and ready for use.

The estimated useful lives of Property, plant and equipment are as follows:

Class of tangible assets	Useful Life
Computer equipment	4
Furniture equipment	10
Office equipment and fittings	5

All assets are depreciated from the month of the asset is available for use up to the month of disposal.

#### (d) Revenue recognition

Revenue is recognized to the extent that it is probable that the economic benefits will flow to the Institute and the revenue can be reliably measured on an accrual basis. Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable. The following specific criteria are used for the purpose of recognition of revenue.

# (i) Membership subscription

Membership subscription is accounted for on time accrual basis.

#### (ci) Interest income

Interest income represents the interest on fixed deposits and is accounted on accrual basis.

# (e) Expenses

All expenditure incurred in the operations of the business and in maintaining the capital assets in a state of efficiency have been charged to income in arriving at the Institute's profit/loss for the year.

#### (f) Funds

# i) Unrestricted funds

Unrestricted funds are those that are available for use by the organization at the discretion of the Committee, in furtherance of the general objectives of the organization and which are not designated for any specific purpose.

### ii) Restricted funds

Where the grants are received for use in an identified project or activity, such funds are held in a restricted fund account and transferred to the statement of income and expenditure to match with expenses incurred in respect of identified project. Utilized funds are held in their respective fund accounts and included under accumulated fund in the statement of financial position until such time as they are required KPMG

#### (f) Funds (Continued)

#### iii) Designated funds

Unrestricted funds designated by the Committee for a specific purpose are identified as designated funds. The activities for which these funds may be used are identified in the financial statements.

#### iv) CILT building fund

CILT building fund is a fund held by the Institute with the purpose of raising funds for a new building. Further the 15% of profits generated from Institute's profitable events are to be transferred this fund.

# (g) Income Tax Expenses

Income tax expense comprises current and deferred tax. Income tax is recognized in the income statement except to the extent that it relates to items recognized directly in equity, in which case it is recognized in equity.

### (i) Current tax

Current tax is the expected tax payable on the taxable income for the year, using tax rates enacted at the reporting date, and any adjustment to tax payable in respect of previous years.

# (ii) Deferred tax

Deferred tax is provided using the liability method, on for temporary differences between the carrying amounts of assets and liabilities for financial reporting purposes and the tax base of assets and liabilities, which is the amount attributed to those assets and liabilities for tax purposes. The amount of deferred tax provided is based on the expected manner of realization or settlement of the carrying amount of assets and liabilities, using tax rates enacted or substantively enacted as at the reporting date. Deferred tax liabilities are not recognized for the permanent differences.

### (h) Events occurring after the reporting date

All material events occurring after reporting date events have been considered and where necessary adjustments to or disclosures in the financial statements have been made.

#### (i) Capital commitments and contingencies

Contingencies are possible assets or obligations that arise from a past event and would be confirmed only on the occurrence or non-occurrence of uncertain future events, which are beyond the Institute's control. Commitments and contingent liabilities are disclosed in notes to the financial statement.
