HOW WE BEGAN

At the Savoy Hotel in London on 3rd November 1919 a group of senior transport professionals met determined to change the world of logistics and transport. In the First World War they had seen the failures of moving goods and vehicles. Now in peacetime they wanted to create a professional body that would make a difference and set new standards. This was the birth of Institute of Transport.

HOW WE PROGRESSED

The group's initial aims were to improve transport efficiency, enable transport integration and encourage talent development in the transport industry. Aims that we still strive to achieve today. In 1926 we were granted a Royal Charter by King George V with himself as the Patron and the Prince of Wales as the Honorary President. The Institute grew in importance and influence across the world. We established territorial organizations in ten countries and in 1971 we were granted the name of the Chartered Institute of Transport by Queen Elizabeth II. In 2001 we became the Chartered Institute of Logistics and Transport as the two leading professional bodies joined together.

The Chartered Institute of Transport (CIT) Sri Lanka was established in 1984 and incorporated by the parliamentary act no. 08 of 2000. In 2001, following the merger of the two leading professional bodies, CIT Sri Lanka became the Chartered Institute of Logistics and Transport (CILT) Sri Lanka. In 2012, the Council of Trustees of CILT upgraded the status of CILT Sri Lanka from a Branch to a Territory. In doing so, the Council of Trustees recognized the high standards in performance, governance and membership development evidenced by CILT Sri Lanka over the past several years. This upgrading of status took place at the CILT International Convention and Annual General Meeting held in Birmingham from 11 - 14 June 2012. The notice of upgrade was presented to Mr. Romesh David, CMILT, then Chairman of CILT Sri Lanka, by Her Royal Highness Princess Anne, the Princess Royal, who is the Patron of the Institute. CILT Sri Lanka is governed by a Council consisting of professionals representing all segments of the Transport and Logistics industry.

CILT Sri Lanka consists of two wings, Women in Logistics and Transport (WiLAT) Sri Lanka and Next Generation Sri Lanka, which are dedicated for the development and empowerment of women and youth of the logistics and transport industry

CILT SRI LANKA SCHOLARSHIPS IN LOGISTICS AND TRANSPORT

The objective of the scholarships is to facilitate future logisticians with required competencies. CILT Sri Lanka strongly believes that capacity building would go a long way in developing and augmenting the performance of the Logistics and Transport industry. Scholarships given by individuals or corporate organizations will be given to Sri Lankan students to follow educational programmes in Logistics and Transport. The scholarships will be branded under the donor or agency name signifying their contribution.

STATUS OF UNIVERSITY ACCREDITATIONS

Accreditation is a process through which professional development qualifications are assessed and endorsed by an independent body. To achieve accreditation, various criteria must be met, including the submission of documents such as course descriptions, syllabus, staff credentials, reading lists, assessment methods, entry requirements, quality assurance measures, external examiner reports, and facility suitability. Accredited undergraduate degree programs typically cover at least 75% of the accrediting body's Key Knowledge Areas (KKA), with a project or dissertation related to logistics or transport.

Accreditation offers benefits such as endorsement by a professional body, benchmarking, professional recognition, and support for course planning. The accreditation process involves fees covering assistance with application preparation, site visits, use of accreditation logos, certificates, and ongoing support. Re-approval and re-accreditation processes are available for program updates or renewal, with associated fees depending on the extent of changes and timing.

Corporate Partnership Program (CPP)

The Corporate Partnership Programme is one of the key priority focus areas for CILT globally with a view to uplifting the image of CILT and promoting the profession among corporates. CILT Sri Lanka launched its CPP in October 2011.

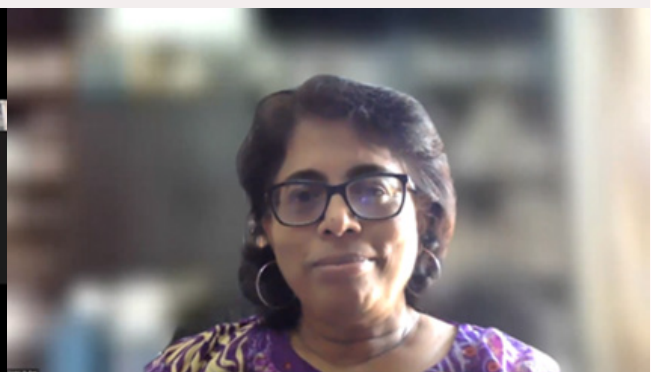

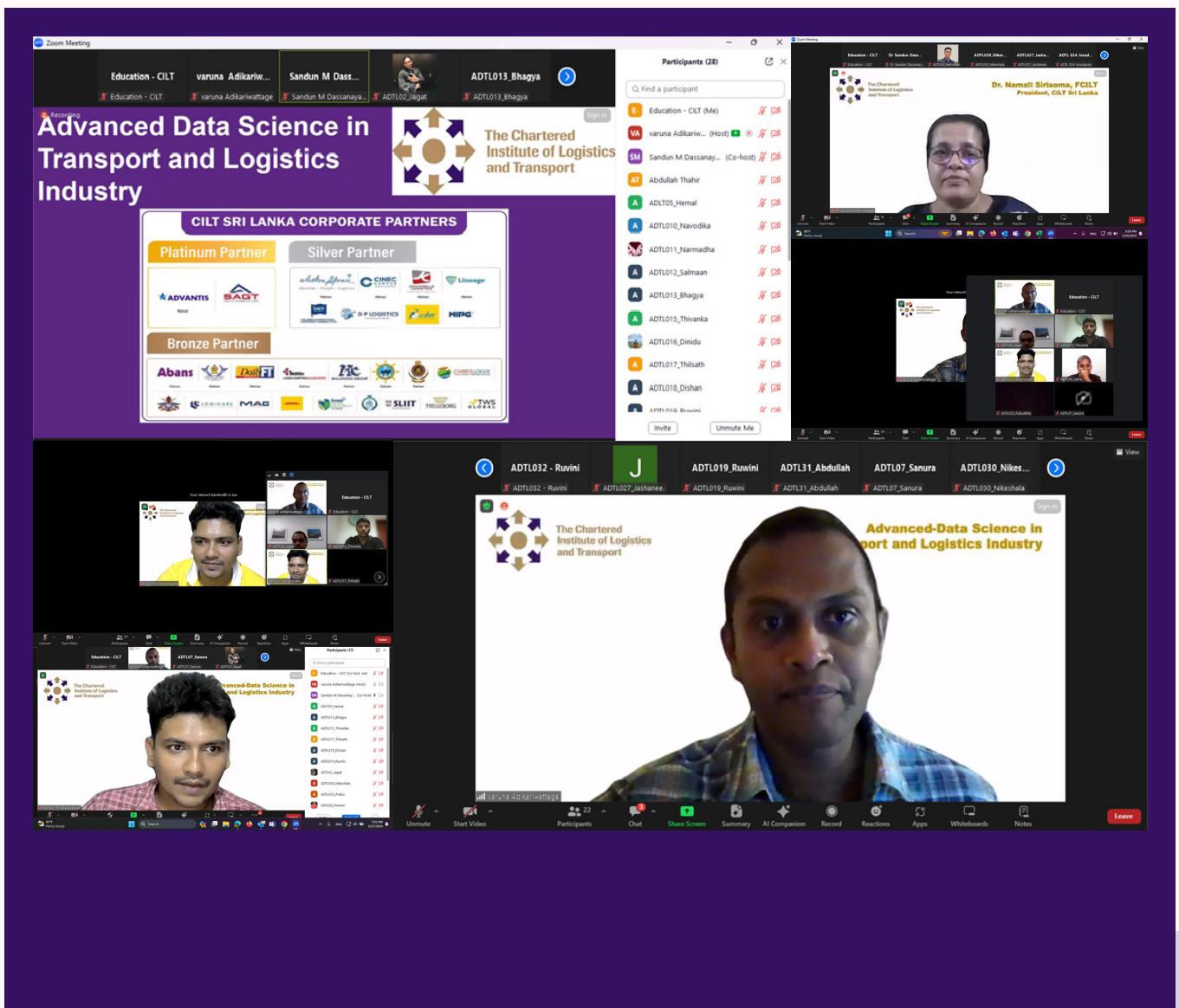

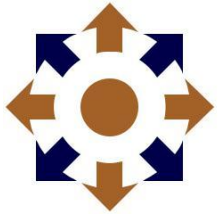

1. CORPORATE INFORMATION

1.1 Reporting Entity

The Chartered Institute of Logistics and Transport Sri Lanka (“the Institute”) is an Association registered and located at 464, T.B Jayah Mawatha, 1st Floor, Colombo 10, Sri Lanka.

1.2 Principal Activities and Nature of Operation

The principal activities of the Institute are to promote and encourage the art and science of logistics and transport. The Association is governed by the Council members in accordance with the rules set out in the rule book of the Association.

2. BASIS OF PREPARATION

2.1 Statement of Compliance

The financial statements of the Institute which comprise of the statement of financial position, statement of income and expenditure and accumulated fund and statement of cash flows together with the accounting policies and notes to the financial statements of the institute as at 31st December 2023 and for the year then ended are prepared in accordance with Sri Lanka Accounting Standard for Small and Medium – sized Entities (“SLFRS for SMEs) adopted by the institute of Chartered Accountants of Sri Lanka (ICASL).

2.2 Responsibility for Financial statements

The committee members are responsible for the preparation and presentation of the Financial Statements.

2.3 Approval of Financial Statements by Committee of members

The Financial Statements for the year ended 31st December 2023, were authorized for issue by the Committee of members on 19th March 2024.

2.4 Basis of Measurement

The Financial Statements have been prepared on the historical cost basis and applied consistently with no adjustments being made for inflationary factors affecting the financial statements.

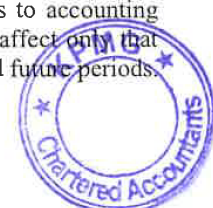
These Financial Statements have been prepared on the basis that the Institute would continue as a going concern for the foreseeable future.

2.5 Functional and Presentation Currency

The Financial Statements are presented in Sri Lankan Rupee (LKR), which is the Institute’s functional currency.

2.6 Use of Estimates and Judgments

The preparation of the financial statements in conformity with SLFRS for SMEs requires management to make judgments, estimates and assumptions that affect the application of accounting policies and the reported amounts of assets, liabilities, income and expenses. Actual results may differ from these estimates. The estimates and underlying assumptions are reviewed on an ongoing basis. Revisions to accounting estimates are recognized in the period in which the estimates are revised if the revision affects only that period or in the period or revision and future periods if the revision affects both current and future periods.

2.7 Materiality and Aggregation

Each material class of similar items is presented separately in the financial statements. Items of a dissimilar nature or function are presented separately unless they are immaterial.

3. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The accounting policies set out below have been applied consistently to all periods presented in these financial statements unless otherwise indicated.

Certain comparative amounts in the financial statements have been reclassified to conform to the current year's presentation.

(a) Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents comprise cash balances and call deposits with maturities of three months or less from the acquisition date that are subject to an insignificant risk of changes in their fair value and are used by the Institute in the management of its short-term commitments. The statement of Cash Flow is reported based on the indirect method.

(b) Property, Plant and Equipment

(i) Recognition and Measurement

Items of property, plant and equipment are measured at cost less accumulated depreciation and accumulated impairment losses. Cost includes expenditure that is directly attributable to the acquisition of the asset. The cost of self-constructed assets includes the Cost of materials and direct labour, any other costs directly attributable to bringing the assets to a working condition for their intended use and when the group of asset to obligation to remove the asset or restore the site, an estimate of the costs of dismantling and removing the items and restoring the site on which they are located, and capitalized borrowing costs. Purchased software that is integral to the functionality of the related equipment is capitalized as part of that equipment.

When an item of property, plant and equipment have different useful lives, they are accounted for as separate items (major components) of property, plant and equipment. Any gains and losses on disposal of an item of property, plant and equipment is recognized in profit or loss.

(ii) Subsequent Measurement

Subsequent expenditure is capitalized only when it is probable that the future economic benefits associated with the expenditure will flow to the Institute incurred.

(c) Property, Plant and Equipment (Continued)

(iii) Depreciation

Items of property, plant and equipment are depreciated on a straight- line basis in profit or loss over the estimated useful lives of each component. Items of property, plant and equipment are depreciated from the date that they are installed and are ready for use, or in respect of internally constructed assets, from the date that the asset is completed and ready for use.

The estimated useful lives of Property, plant and equipment are as follows:

All assets are depreciated from the month of the asset is available for use up to the month of disposal.

(c) Revenue recognition

Revenue is recognized to the extent that it is probable that the economic benefits will flow to the Institute and the revenue can be reliably measured on an accrual basis. Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable. The following specific criteria are used for the purpose of recognition of revenue.

(i) Membership subscription

Membership subscription is accounted for on time accrual basis.

(ii) Interest income

Interest income represents the interest on fixed deposits and is accounted on accrual basis.

(e) Expenses

All expenditure incurred in the operations of the business and in maintaining the capital assets in a state of efficiency have been charged to income in arriving at the Institute's profit/loss for the year.

(f) Funds

i) Unrestricted funds

Unrestricted funds are those that are available for use by the organization at the discretion of the Committee, in furtherance of the general objectives of the organization and which are not designated for any specific purpose.

ii) Restricted funds

Where the grants are received for use in an identified project or activity, such funds are held in a restricted fund account and transferred to the statement of income and expenditure to match with expenses incurred in respect of identified project. Utilized funds are held in their respective fund accounts and included under accumulated fund in the statement of financial position until such time as they are required.

(f) Funds (Continued)

iii) Designated funds

Unrestricted funds designated by the Committee for a specific purpose are identified as designated funds. The activities for which these funds may be used are identified in the financial statements.

iv) CILT building fund

CILT building fund is a fund held by the Institute with the purpose of raising funds for a new building. Further the 15% of profits generated from Institute's profitable events are to be transferred this fund.

(g) Income Tax Expenses

Income tax expense comprises current and deferred tax. Income tax is recognized in the income statement except to the extent that it relates to items recognized directly in equity, in which case it is recognized in equity.

(i) Current tax

Current tax is the expected tax payable on the taxable income for the year, using tax rates enacted at the reporting date, and any adjustment to tax payable in respect of previous years.

(ii) Deferred tax

Deferred tax is provided using the liability method, on for temporary differences between the carrying amounts of assets and liabilities for financial reporting purposes and the tax base of assets and liabilities, which is the amount attributed to those assets and liabilities for tax purposes. The amount of deferred tax
